2021- 2022 - Our headline statistics



During 2021-2022 we had:

- 68460 individual contacts with families
- 24164 individual users of our website and exceeded our blog post view target of 3000 by 292% with 7909 views
- 1638 followers on Facebook and 1195 followers on Instagram
- Received **584** referrals for 1:1 support or targeted programmes
- Achieved 96% of outcomes we set with our families.
- Met or exceeded target attendance numbers on 90% of our programmes – for example
 - Little Explorers session of **1012** against target of 288
 - Baby Massage 246 attendees against target of 48
- 756 families accessed Vitamin D through our centres



About Early Years Alliance



Early Years Alliance (the Alliance) is a national educational charity established in 1961. Delivering community-based services for children and families across Lewisham for over 60 years, we have a strong local presence.

Our mission is to ensure that all children, regardless of background, are given the best possible start in life.





The Alliance have been commissioned to deliver services in Children's Centres in Lewisham since April 2017. This includes delivery of a wide range of universal stay and play sessions, as well as parenting courses, programmes and workshops, a 1:1 family support service, a domestic abuse recovery service, and an outreach service into local schools, parks and community spaces.



Children & Family Centres – Our Approach

- In Lewisham Children and Family Centres provided by Early Years Alliance, we have actively shaped our universal offer around the **1001 days** for many years, to ensure that those vital formative first years are embedded in all our work with families to give them that best start in life.
- We use **Five to Thrive** as the framework to raise parental awareness of the science of brain development to support attachment and attunement between parent/carer and child.
- Based on a model of progressive universalism, we provide open-access services for all children and families, with some additional enhanced programmes for those families who need extra support.









During 2021-2022, we focused delivery on some key priorities:

- Providing services for families who have had a new baby during Covid to reduce isolation and give peer support, access to information from a skilled and knowledgeable team
- Ensuring we provided a blended model of face-to-face and online services and programmes to enable as wide an access to services as possible
- Continuing delivery of our range of parenting programmes at all levels
- Continuing delivery of domestic abuse recovery programmes for children, including piloting an innovative programme for children under 4
- Developing and rolling out our new Family Practitioner 1:1 support service
- Continuing to expand our website and social media to reach more families digitally in a range of different ways



We kept our centres open throughout the year and reached out into the community as other services started to re-open, while ensuring we responded to changing Covid regulations, keeping our service users safe, supported and connected.

Universal Programmes – an overview



We continued to focus the universal sessions in centres primarily for parents with babies under 6 months, during the first part of 2021, increasing to 18 months as the year progressed.

Our sessions offered parents who hadn't had much exposure to groups or support networks due to Covid an opportunity to come together to lessen the isolation many told us they were feeling.

Listen to families talk about how we help combat isolation and prevent problems through our universal services:



"The children's centres are a great resource for me as a first time mum. The support and activities have helped me so much. My little one really enjoys things like Little Explorers and Baby Massage,

I enjoy the chance to meet other parents as well"

We offer evidence-based courses as part of our universal offer, including HENRY workshops and courses, Triple P parenting discussion groups and IAIM evidence-based Baby Massage courses. We have a strong focus on outdoor learning, and we are also working with Greenwich University to develop the evidence-base for **Owl Babies**, and **64** families benefited from attending this in the past year.

As part of our strategy to combat obesity, we commissioned HENRY to train our staff in 2020.



HENRY is a course and a series of workshops to support parents to make positive and healthy life choices.


During 2021- 2022 **190** families benefited from HENRY groups.

Our Outreach Team delivered workshops in school and the community to promote messages on healthy eating with **73** families attending Creative Chef Workshops.

Universal Programmes – Outreach

Our pro-active outreach team have also been going to community spaces to take information and services to where parents already are and enable wider access.

Outreach includes service delivery in schools, hostels, parks, community spaces and this year in the refugee hotel in Lee.

The team have been working with partners such as the Family Information Service (FIS) to deliver online 'coffee morning' style workshops to families on topical issues such as choosing childcare or accessing key benefits.



- 35 courses/ workshops delivered in 17 venues in the community.
- 56 families offered light touch support to access services
- 79 families attended FIS coffee mornings
- 92 individuals accessed Outdoor Explorers in Forster Park









Universal Programmes – Outreach

Our Outreach Workers support families to access services in community venues, including in schools: services such as foodbanks, basic resources projects, parenting programmes, FEEE (nursery offers), mental health and wellbeing support, employment and benefit support, form filling and referrals into other local services. Many of the families supported have at least two presenting issues (from the governments 'Supported Families criteria') and achieved positive outcomes.

Universal Programmes – Triple P Parenting


As part of our Early Intervention and Prevention strategy we have developed and expanded our evidence-based parenting delivery of Triple P as part of our universal offer during 2021-2022.

A total of 206 Individuals accessed support through our Triple P suite of programmes:

- 62 Individuals completed Triple P Level 4 group
- 102 Individuals attended Discussion groups
- 42 Individuals accessed support through the 1:1 'triage'
 Feel Positive about Parenting session

We enhanced accessibility through rotating the centre of delivery around the borough, including in schools, and by offering daytime and evening courses, and a blended mix of face to face and online courses.

"The non-judgemental supportive space created by the facilitators and other parents felt normalising and reassuring of my parenting concerns. The honest interactions with other parents was my favourite part of the process."




Digital access and reach

- Our comprehensive website with timetables, blog, information, links to other services and delivery of borough updates received 24164 new unique visits and 79 online enquiries.
- We had 7640 blog post views, exceeding our target of 3000 by 292% with <u>OWL Babies</u>, <u>Toilet Training</u> and <u>Struggling with your Energy Bills</u> blogs being amongst the most popular.
- Our active social media pages have 1638 follows on <u>Facebook</u> and 1195 on <u>Instagram</u> with each post reaching an average of 174 users.



Digital access and reach

We have a comprehensive online offer enabling greater flexibility of access for families to our programmes, information and support.

- We have a significant offer of courses and workshops offered online with 305 parents accessing our courses online.
- We have made space available in our centres for families who have wi-fi or data issues or barriers at home to enable access to services online
- Headphones are supplied to parents for home access if they are needed for participants in our more targeted programmes
- We developed safeguarding protocols and procedures and training for staff to ensure safe online delivery with vulnerable families
- We supported an additional 39 families to access targeted support - picked up through the 79 'contact us' enquiries received via our website







Targeted Programmes - overview

Based on our model of progressive universalism, in addition to the bedrock of universal services for all children and families, we also provide some enhanced and targeted services for those families who need additional support.

Our aim with these enhanced services is to give support as early as possible, to prevent escalation of need, prevent referrals to Family Thrive and Children's Social Care, and support families on the CAMHS Waiting List.

Targeted support - Family Practitioner Service

In early 2021, the Commissioning Team asked us to reshape our family support offer to work at a lower level than we had previously. The new service is positioned below the level of support provided by the LA, through the newly formed Family Thrive team, and as part of the tiered approach of the borough to supporting families in need of additional help.

After a period of restructure and recruitment, we fully launched the new

Family Practitioner Service in July 2021.



Our new service sits within the I-Thrive Framework at the 'Getting Advice and Getting Help' stages and uses a 6-8 week intervention model. We use the Family
Star Early Years as
a tool for assessing
and evidencing
outcomes.

Family Practitioners support families particularly when isolated and/or new to the borough to access children's centres, health services, SEN support, nursery and school, and work to offer solutions to practical needs, linking to local services such as food banks, emergency resources, medical services and families with no recourse to public funds. Family Practitioner Service – parental feedback

"I felt ashamed and embarrassed to reach out and get that support, but she always encouraged me and it's like a weight has lifted off my shoulder"

Some families participated in a review of year one of the service. They all spoke very highly of the skills and qualities of the practitioners who supported them and greatly valued the practical and emotional support they received. They identified the "magic ingredients" that impacted their lives.

"They showed warmth, empathy and understanding – were non-judgmental and cared about my family."

"The practitioner was reliable and consistent - doing what they said they would do and letting me know if it couldn't be done"

"They really listened - and showed that they had heard me" "You were a lifeline to me during the weeks you were supporting me. My GP is great, and we have a very good relationship, but they are so busy and can hardly get an appointment.

Having you there to talk to every week without any judgement was a life saver."

"They treated me as an important human being."



Targeted support - CYP IAPT Parenting

With additional funding from CCG, the EYA CYP IAPT offer is focused on supporting parents to meet their child's needs and improving behaviour for children with serious/high risk behavioural problems, conduct disorders such as oppositional defiance disorder, and where ADHD might be a suspected or a diagnosed issue.

We work closely with Lewisham CAMHS to offer support to parents' pre-assessment and to those on their waiting list awaiting treatment.

68 participants received CYP IAPT parenting support during the year.

Programmes provided are:

- Incredible Years 12-week group for parents of children aged 4-11 years delivered online and in person
- PIPT (Personalised Individual Parent Training) Intensive 1:1
 support delivered over 6 sessions to parents and children aged 4-8 years

In January 2022, we received new funding through Health Education England, to train additional Parenting Therapists and we will also introduce a new **Systemic Family Practice** service as part of our offer in 2022.

Targeted support - Domestic Abuse Recovery

We help families access specific domestic abuse services and a range of group activities within our own Centres. Our focus is on supporting children and families who have experienced domestic abuse through their recovery.

Our main programmes are:

- Freedom a group for women who are at risk, have experienced or are experiencing Domestic Abuse, also delivered as 1:1 offer
- CODA a therapeutic programme for children aged 4 and over who have experienced abuse, which also supports mothers, also delivered as 1:1 offer

We have delivered to **86 families this year** through our children's centre offer, with additional families supported through funding as part of the CADA and the WWCSC borough-wide projects.



- Supporting children's early language and communication as part of the Best Start in Speech,
 Language and Communication Strategy for the borough
- Developing services for children with SEND in partnership with Portage and others
- Developing and improving our Family Practitioner Service, working alongside Family Thrive
- Continuing to deliver programmes that support children and families who have experienced domestic abuse, including roll-out of the new CODA Under 4s and VOICE Programmes
- Expanding CYP IAPT offer to include Systemic Family Therapy, working closely with CAMHS
- Continuing to deliver our blended offer to families, supporting Covid recovery, and responding to evolving local needs
